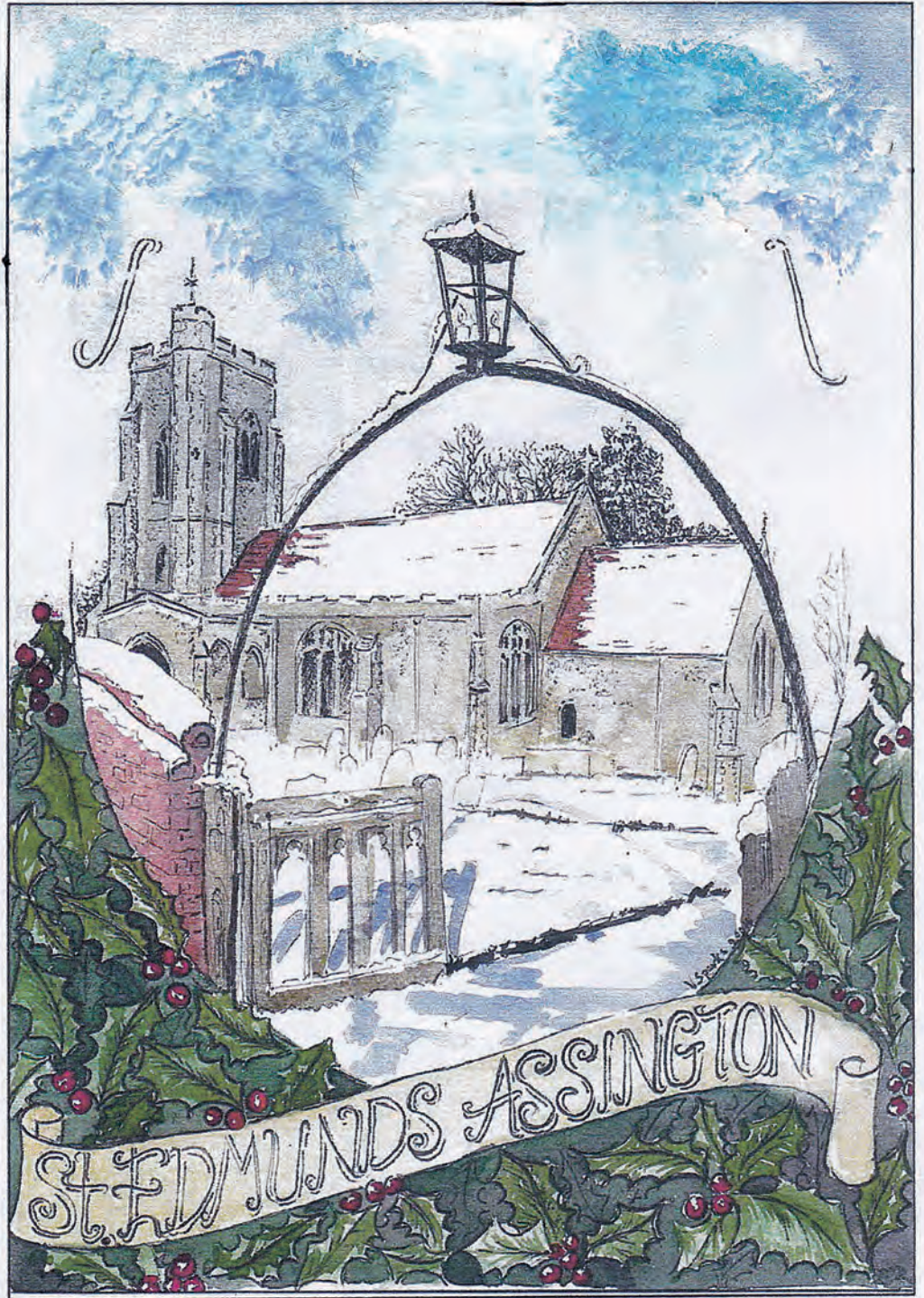

NEIL JONES



We are very sad to report that Neil died on Wednesday 5th November, aged 78, following a long illness.

Neil and his wife Julia have been long-standing residents of Partridge Row, where they have lived for 17 years.



Neil contributed to the life of the village in a number of ways, but perhaps one that will strike a chord with many of us was, as a musician. He played the bass guitar as a member of the group "Takin' Time" for the BBQ after the Village Fete in 2021, and again, (this time only Neil and Nick) at the village celebrations for Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee.

They were just brilliant - they rocked the village, and we loved every second of it!

In other roles, Neil, along with Julia, presided over the "Guess the Wine" stand at the Village Fetes for several years.



In the October 2018 Assington News magazine, Neil contributed an article about his Stone Age (Mesolithic) flints, 'pot boilers' and hammer stones which he had found in his garden on land which used to be the Orchards. In the November 2018 magazine he wrote about the common lizards in this garden, and his designated "lizard sanctuary" near an old greenhouse, where he took photographs of various lizards, enjoying a spot of sunbathing.

Julia recounts how he loved it here and never once wanted to go back to their homeland, Wales. She says " I think it was something to do with the weather".

Neil's funeral will take place on Monday December 1st at Bures Baptist Church at 11am.

NATURE WATCH

ROUND-UP OF THE YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS

We are lucky to live in Assington, with the very high species count that we have. For instance, in Spring another Stag Beetle found in Assington Street was a very welcome sight, they have been turning up periodically here, and along Leavenheath High Road.

Two Nightingales pairs were in a hedge at Tiger Hill, and three pairs at Hulbacks (it's the males that sing), every year we hope for a return of the better numbers of the past. Also at Tiger Hill were two Flycatchers, this charming bird was once so common, nesting on houses, does it still does so annually, in the locality I wonder.

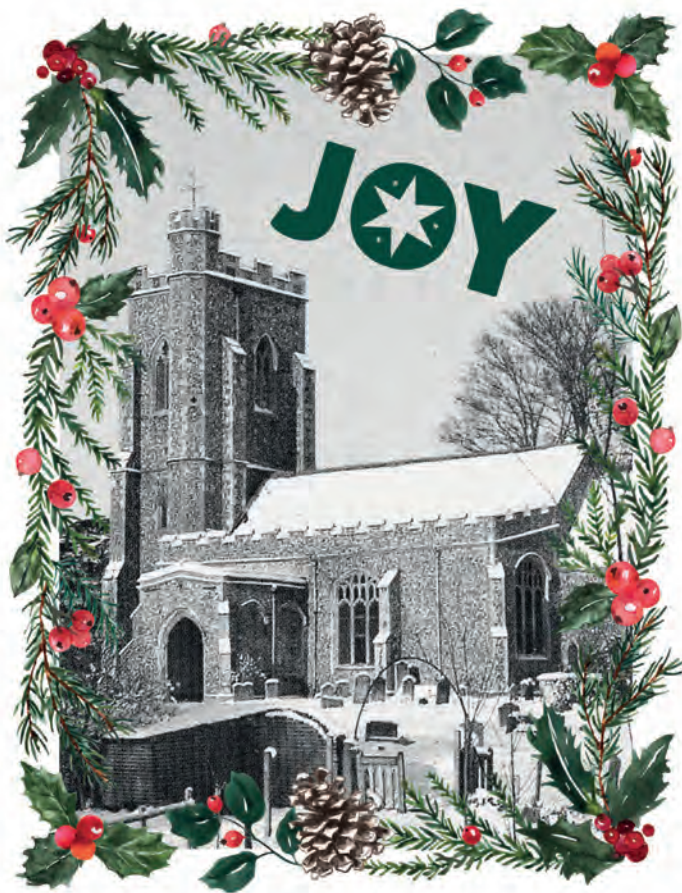
The Red Kite is now a familiar sight of course, the first breeding we know of in Assington was six years ago, when two young were successfully raised. Only very occasionally however do we hear its call, which is unlike that of other raptors: a long rather quiet whistle, finishing in unique warbling notes. The Raven is also increasing around the area, and its echoing "cronk" is heard quite regularly. In the past the idea would have seemed ludicrous that these birds, and the Buzzard, would return to Suffolk, yet they've now been resident here for some years. But who would have dreamt that our Swallow and House Martin colonies would crash so severely as they have.

Spring flowers did well this year, it seems that in some places the ravages of Muntjac deer were less. However the drought that's followed, was bad news for flowering. Among other comments, one seasoned naturalist commented they hadn't seen a single Orchid all year. In their part of the county. We can really say 2025 was a patchy year for wildlife, as well as pretty disastrous for humans. Butterflies were doing better than last year's disastrous slump, however the improvement didn't really persist beyond midsummer. Also, many people reported missing their Blackbirds, a victim of disease; as well as the loss in recent years of many Finches, all of which shows that scrupulous disinfecting of bird feeders is essential, and probably that no feeder should be used year-round. Also please feed only in gardens, not in woods or other wild places. Lots of colourful Fungi are usual in certain parts of the parish, but at time of writing, 8th November, numbers are so low, we might as well be in the desert, with autumn showers having no benefit. Curiously, the bright red Fly Agaric did well!

One bird that has had a very bad year for breeding is the Barn Owl, presumably the result of low numbers of Voles, which is a periodic occurrence. Chicks were found and ringed in only two nest boxes locally, and that was late in the season, let's hope those chicks are managing to build up strength before any wet winter weather.

Recording of Bats is always improving, these days there are static detectors which record for around a fortnight, and accurately identify the species, they give a print-out of how many times each species came within range, on which nights. One Bat now known to be doing well round here is the Barbastelle, it's known to avoid areas with much artificial light, so the borders of Suffolk are now known to be a stronghold.

With the adverse and unpredictable weather of recent times, each year I fret over what will the next year be like, better or worse. All we can say for sure is that it's unpredictable.

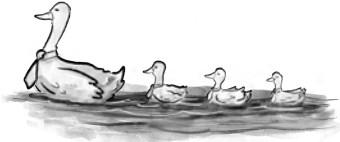

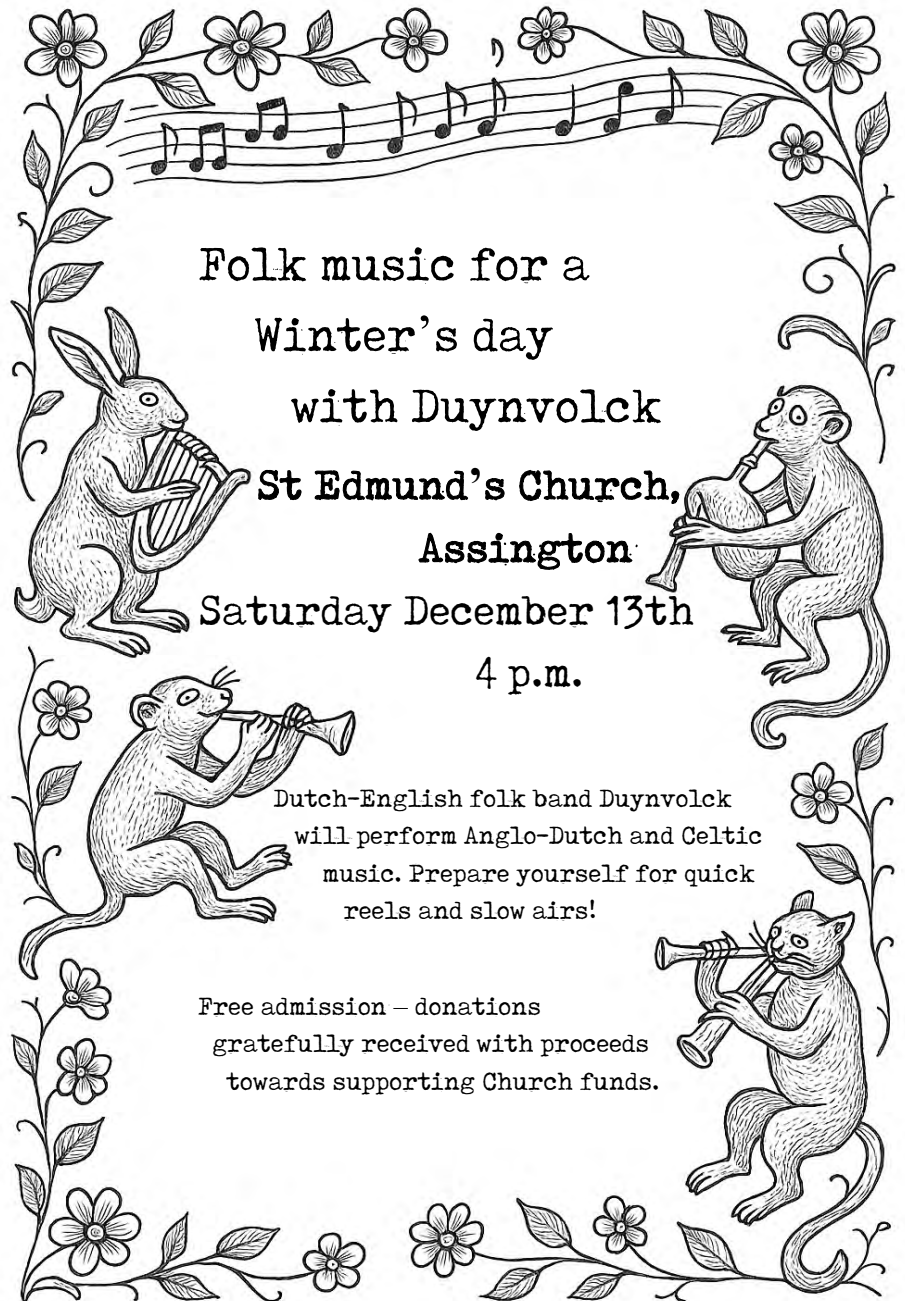

REMEMBRANCE SERVICE



We were blessed with a wonderfully mild autumnal day for our Remembrance Day Service.

Dean Howard, retired Warrant Officer in REME gave the address during the Service, and laid the wreath on behalf of Assington Residents, beneath the WWI wall monument.

At the end of the church service the Colour party processed to the War Grave outside, that of Private Albert Jakeman , 3rd Regiment Durham Light Infantry, who died on 19 January 1918 aged 19.

WO (Retired) Howard laid the wreath on Assington's Official War Grave, and RBL Standard Bearer Wiles performed the ceremonial drill in respect.

Our thanks to David Wiles for performing this ceremony with great passion for the past several years; we have been greatly honoured to have been able to host his support on these important national occasions.

Remembrance Standard From David Wiles

Hi All,

For the last 5 years it has been my honour to carry the union standard through the village on Remembrance Sunday to remember our fallen heroes through all conflicts.

My home Royal British Legion Branch is Nayland, where my father was born and is interred in the churchyard at St. James church. His Father served in The Royal Horse artillery in WW1 then in the Royal Artillery in WW2 serving in Europe , north Africa and Burma.

Family history: my other grandfather served in The Royal Navy in WW1 on HMS Diligence, a supply ship for ammunition and ordinance to the Atlantic destroyer fleet at the battle of Jutland. His was one of the first ships to reach HMS Vanguard when it exploded in Scapa Flow with only 2 survivors.

My own father served as an RAF Air crash rescue firefighter during his national service . I am very proud to wear their medals on the other side every year.

This year was my last for Assington as I am now Standard Bearer elect for Nayland, taking up the position from the 24th November, to which my grandfather and father would be very proud. I sincerely thank everyone for their support over the last 5 years, especially those who attended The Tabor Academy Festival of Remembrance. I am very proud of my family that served our country, and being a member of The Royal British Legion. Thank you all again.

At the going down of the sun, and in the morning, we will remember them.

"A Christmas Carol"

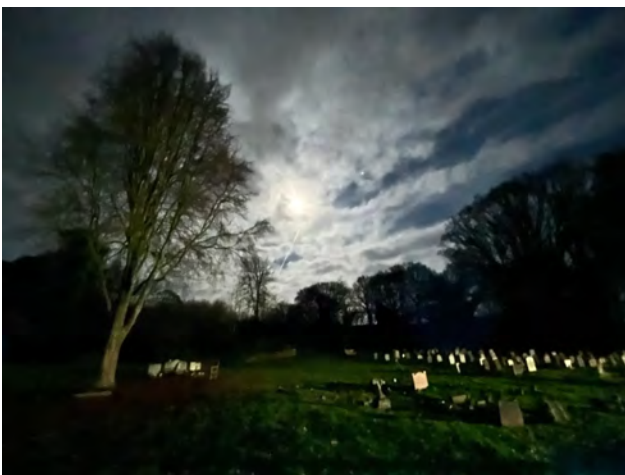
"The Red Barn Murder"

In addition, Jackson works with other creatives, including storyteller Dan Sedgewick and podcasts such as "In the Spotlight" and "Chapter 82".

Most of CB Jackson's shows are private functions but there are about 20 public shows a year. Munnings Art Museum was one of the venues for these events;

ALL HALLOWS CRAFTS AND FUN FOR CHILDREN

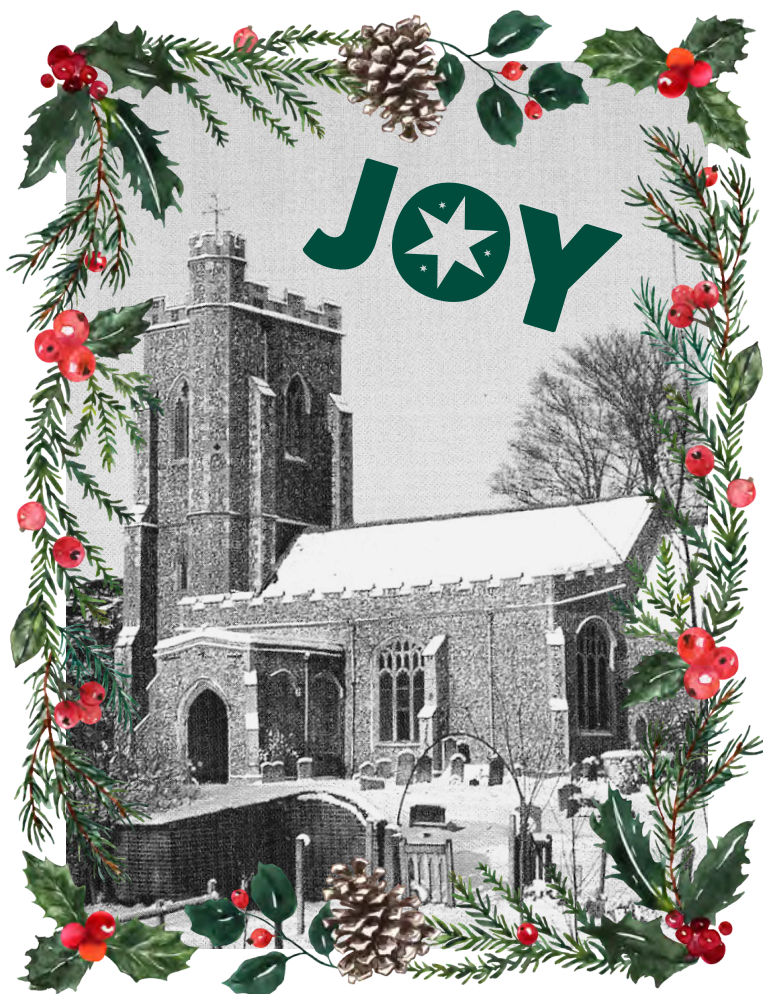

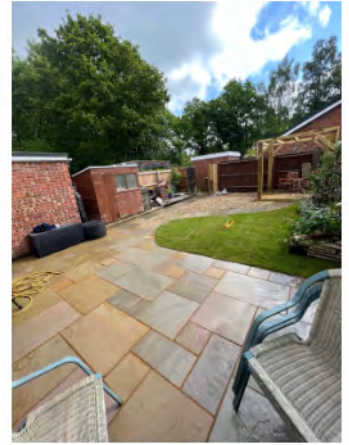

Letter from the

Dear friends

Have you ever tried to foretell the future? How did you do (if you're not still waiting to find out)? Sure, it's not too hard to make general predictions about things that follow a natural pattern. For instance, "In a few weeks' time mince pies will disappear from the supermarket shelves and be replaced by Easter eggs." But what about correctly forecasting very unusual events, years, or even centuries before they take place?

I've heard of a rise of people visiting a "medium" or seeking out fortune telling. We might be keen to know our future, but did you know that God has told us that trying to in these sorts of ways can only be bad for us?

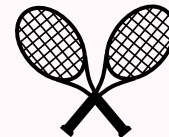
