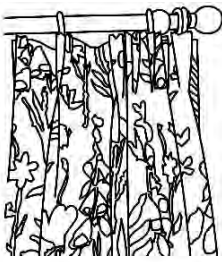

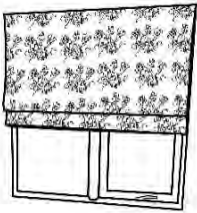

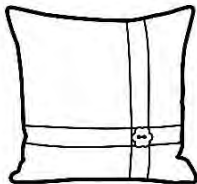

# GOING TO VISIT RONNIE

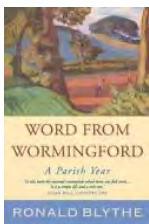

I first visited Ronald Blythe at Bottengoms, his charming farmhouse in Wormingford, in 2009.

I had previously read several of his books: Word from Wormingford and Borderlands being the first two volumes of a collection of his writings for The Church Times. I also knew he was famous for writing Akenfield Portrait of an English Village, which had been made into a film by Peter Hall in 1974. I knew several people who knew Ronnie and then one of them decided to take me to visit him.



Bottengoms had been the home of the artist John Nash and his wife Christine. Ronnie was part of their circle of close friends and after Christine died he cared for John in his final illness. The house and its contents were left to him and he has lived there alone for over 40 years.



Ronnie in his Akenfield chair

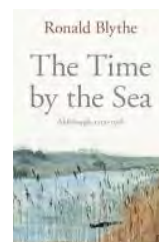
Ronnie welcomed us at the door and ushered us inside where a table was set with tea and a plate of biscuits. After tea and a good chat about churches, wild flowers and mutual acquaintances we toured the house including Ronnie's bedroom which was formerly John Nash's studio.

Before leaving we looked round part of the garden and seeing his vegetable plot I admired his recently planted out lettuces and was rewarded with a box of seedlings to take home. The roses were in full bloom and very lovely. The White Cat met us on the step before we left and was not in the least afraid of David's dog. I have subsequently visited Ronnie several more times with mutual friends.

In March 2013 to celebrate Ronnie's 90th birthday the previous November a joyful and poetic event was held at Nayland Church which I attended and when a ceremony was held at Wormingford Church in January 2018 for Ronnie to receive his CBE I was also lucky enough to be there.

For those unfamiliar with Ronald Blythe's writing I suggest starting with Word from Wormingford but here is a review of his most recent work published in 2013; well he is 97!

## BOOK REVIEW: The Time by the Sea by Ronald Blythe



This is an account of Ronnie's life in and around Aldeburgh during the 1950s when Benjamin Britten was gathering around himself a coterie of artistic talents during the early years of The Aldeburgh Festival.

It is the tale of a young man with no money trying to make himself useful. Much of the time he is cold or hungry. E M Forster pushes a note under his door inviting him round for a drink, Imogen Holst whips up scrambled eggs on toast for them both late at night and 'Ben' sends him on a mission to persuade the vicar of Blythburgh to allow a concert to take place in his church. 'The Aldeburgh Festival? Are you a band?'

These are events I have heard recounted by Ronnie himself on several occasions. We also hear about the exuberant members of the East Anglian School of Painting at Benton End, Hadleigh. There is also much about the 18th /19th century Suffolk poets George Crabbe and Edward Fitzgerald. Read the book to find out more. By **ELLIE MEAD**

Ronald Blythe is a prolific author: Akenfield is probably his most famous book, a colourful, perceptive portrayal of English country life reverberates with the voices of the village inhabitants, from the reminiscences of survivors of the Great War evoking days gone by, to the concerns of a younger generation of farm-workers and the fascinating and personal recollections of, among others, the local schoolteacher, doctor, blacksmith, saddler, district nurse and magistrate. Providing insights into farming, education, welfare, class, religion and death, Akenfield forms a unique document of a way of life that has, in many ways, disappeared.



"Local girl" Lynn Crossman (nee Brooks), formerly of Hill Farm, was one of the actresses in the Peter Hall film (mentioned above), as the bride of Akenfield.

# NATURE WATCH

Tiger Hill has had more Harebells than ever this autumn, and many big patches of them could also be seen on the Sheepwalks fields towards Moors Farm. Other small pretty flowers of heathland also did well in the drought conditions.



The short damp spell in September brought a mass of fungi at Tiger Hill, including the enormous Parasols, and others that were yellow, red, purple and charcoal in colour. So hopefully by the time you read this, the main flush of autumn fungi will be very good.



A stag beetle at Tiger Hill was a "first" for our area, please let me know if you have seen any others in Assington, as hitherto Leavenheath High Road has been the nearest.

When weather is cold, I have several times over the years found a dead green woodpecker, and I did again on that terrible day at the end of September. Bird life has seemed plentiful, though in autumn there's usually a quiet gap, when a lot of small birds have migrated south, and before the winter migrants arrive from the north and east. Of course, the families of tits and so on with their young are calling to each other, and visibly beginning to form their winter flocks.

Again this summer, numbers of swifts, swallows and martins were rather low. With the winter migrants soon arriving, we must hope for some good sightings from Eddie Sinwarbler and others. Where birch seeds are to be found, as in Spouses Grove, then twittering flocks of redpoll can be seen; last year though there was a lack of the usual flocks of siskin feeding on alder seeds; the expanses of alders round Assington are exceptional, as they are largely absent from much of Suffolk. Mind, you can have too much alder!

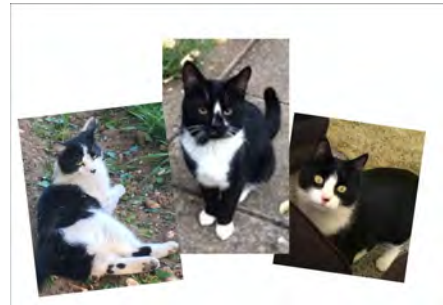
Results of dormouse recording in the area continue to be dismal, but with muntjacs seeming possibly fewer this year, there has been some slight return of woodland undergrowth which gives us hope. What a sight earlier in the autumn, were the quantities of toadflax (yellow & orange) and lesser calamint (mauve) along the roadsides. Toadflax is a "common" plant, but its flowers are usually mown off, so the drought year must have benefited it, perhaps either from less mowing. or a late second flowering. Certainly, second flowering has been conspicuous in gardens and the countryside this year.

## MISSING CATS APPEAL

Everyone at SESAW is devastated that despite all our efforts we have still not been able to locate three cats that went missing shortly after their arrival in August. They were brought in and signed over to SESAW when their previous owner had to move away for employment reasons and sadly was unable to take the cats. We have never experienced such a devastating event in nearly thirty years of rescue and wish never to do so again.



We have distributed posters locally and posted on Facebook, followed up suspected sightings and advised vets. Traps are in place and checked regularly, unfortunately these are occasionally interfered with by some misguided persons but we remain steadfast in our search.

Can we please ask that you keep an eye open for these three cheeky boys, two of which were neither neutered nor microchipped. This was to be rectified by our Vet the next day, had they not spent their first night digging an escape route.

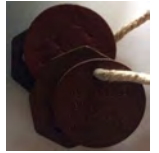

# TIME TO REMEMBER

The builders were on their 'last leg' of renovation work for us, and were working partly in the barn, when Ian (one of the workmen) spotted a trunk, being used for storage. Being interested in war memorabilia and all associated events, he said to me:  
 "You should do some research to find out the background details of the person who owned that trunk", to which I replied: "I don't need to because I know whose trunk it was - it belonged to my father!"



This exchange, however, acted as a spur to me to do more follow-up research on the documents and other mementos which I had, some time previously, looked over and packed away, for safekeeping. They proved to tell a story, which I found both interesting and moving.

My father was born on 12 November 1920, and this Remembrance Day will be one day before what would have been his 100th birthday. Unfortunately, he died too young, at only 60 years of age.

When I was a baby, he spent a significant period of time in a TB Sanatorium, having experienced a number of severe illnesses during his wartime service, and continued to suffer ill health for the rest of his life.

So I opened up the box, and pieced together the treasures to make the story of my Father's war-time service.

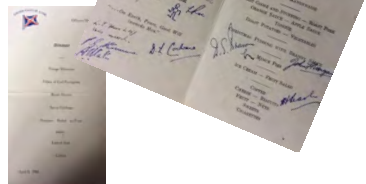
War was declared on 3 September 1939, when my father was still 18 years old. He volunteered as a reserve member of the RAF, and subsequently undertook his training as a Flight Lieutenant and Navigator.

There are photographs and log books charting his progress through the various stages of training and flying:

Scotland, London, Liverpool, Across the Atlantic to Canada: Alberta and Prince Edward Island; thence to Palestine, Cyprus, and finally, the theatre of war which was Burma, followed by the Japanese Surrender in Malaya, and the flights and ship home on the RMMV Cape Town Castle, from Singapore to Southampton.

During his Service with 211 Squadron in Burma, the pilot he flew with in 1945 prior to the Japanese surrender, was R M Reichstein, an Australian member of the RAAF (Royal Australian Air Force).

According to the Burma Star Association, flying conditions were extremely hazardous: the monsoon rain and winds made a plane in the air uncontrollable, and there were also attacks from the Japanese 'Zeros' to contend with.

They mainly flew in Beaufighters and Harvards. Their role was to search from the air along the railways and rivers to seek and destroy Japanese supply lines.

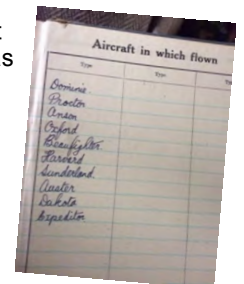
Among the keepsakes is an enormous map of the Arakan and Mandalay; red lines and red dots and crosses indicate either areas or sites "of interest" and also the sites of destruction:



- .....".Patrol BASSEIN waterways. 1 barge destroyed.
- RP attack on suspected RADAR - 4 strikes.
- Attack on gun position RANGOON RIVER - direct hits....."

At the back of his Flying Log Book is a list of aircraft in which my father flew (some as a passenger):

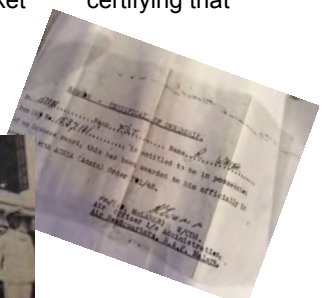

# ASSINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

## Matters of Interest Discussed at A Meeting held in Assington Village Hall on Monday 28 September 2020

### ■ Apologies for Absence

Councillor Simon Thorogood, County Councillor James Finch and Babergh District Councillor Lee Parker sent their apologies which were accepted

### ■ Declaration of Interest and Requests for Dispensation

No declaration of Interest or requests for dispensation had been received.

### ■ Minutes of Meeting held on 7th September 2020

The minutes of the meeting were approved and signed by the Vice Chairman as a correct record.

### ■ Public Forum

No updates received from SCC Finch or BDC Parker.  
**The public meeting was closed.**

### ■ Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr Wallace informed Councillors that they should all have received a copy of the plan and Cllr Symonds congratulated the NP team on the plan and all their hard work.

### ■ Routine Correspondence

a. Councillors agreed that this was a matter to raise with SCC Finch and to raise the large vehicles encroaching on residents' verges at the next meeting.

b. Councillors agreed that Suffolk Broadband should be contacted with details of the areas in the village without broadband to see if when the new buildings are built the broadband can be extended to these areas. Clerk to liaise with Cllr Symonds before contacting Suffolk Broadband.

c. Councillors agreed that they are interested in enhancing biodiversity and had confirmed to BDC that they would like to take up the offer of trees to plant in the village. Whilst waiting to hear back from BDC they will look at suitable areas of land which ideally would be accessible to all to make a wildlife area.

d. Since the agenda had been distributed an email had been received from Andrew Reid, SCC Cabinet Member for Highways that officers will be writing to the Local Planning Authority case officer to clarify the Highways response to Planning Application - DC/20/03362

### ■ Finance

- Councillors reviewed the Asset Register and resolved that it accurately reflected the council's assets at this time.
- Councillors reviewed the Insurance Cover and agreed payment to CAS proposed Cllr Symonds and seconded by Cllr Stacey
- All cheques signed and due for signing as itemised in appendix B, were authorised by the Councillors. The Councillors noted the income received since the last meeting and reconciliation of bank accounts against the bank statements, and Statement of Accounts against the Budget.

Councillor Wallace clarified the position with regards to the Neighbourhood Plan spend of £6,326.48, which seemed high for the 2020/21 year. This is due to a payment to Places4People which was paid with the 2019/20 grant received but the cheque had been cleared in this financial year. The actual NP spend in 2020/21 currently is £3,239 and the grant received for the current financial year is for £5,074.

### ■ Review of Key Policies

- Councillors agreed that no changes were required to the Financial regulations and Standing Orders.
- Councillors agreed that no changes were required to the Document Retention Policy.

### ■ Planning

a. Consider **Planning Application - DC/20/03353** - Change of use of agricultural land to domestic garden and erection of post and rail fencing at land rear of School Lodge and L'Ecole, The Street, Assington and resolved to **support** the application.

b. Status of **Planning Applications** and Cllr Hill had received information that APP/D3505/W/20/3250773 had been withdrawn.

### ■ Walk the Parish

Councillors Symonds and Wallace will walk the parish and report back on the village assets.

### ■ Traffic Speed Reduction Plan

Councillor Hill advised that the speed survey in the village was taking place this week and it was agreed to defer discussion until the next meeting.

### ■ Definitive Map

Councillor Hill advised that a local resident was asking for support from the Parish Council for his application for the disused part of the 'old' main road, from opposite the entrance drive of Assington Hall to opposite Aveley Lane (TL938388 -> TL939387) to be identified on the Definitive Map as a Public Right of Way. Councillors agreed that residents had used this route as a public path for as long as memories can recall and agreed to support the application.

### ■ Recruitment of a new Parish Clerk

Councillor Stacey advised that the position had been advertised with an increase to hours to 5.5 average hours per week and an increase in salary range to 7-12, depending on qualification and experience.. The deadline for applications was the 1st November 2020.

### ■ Questions to the Chair

- Councillors noted their concern that the pub was closed and wanted to express their support for the owner in looking for new tenants.
- The Councillors wished to express their thanks to Bryn Hurren for putting on the Horticultural Show and were very grateful for all his hard work in making it a success, particularly with such challenging conditions this year.

### ■ Next Meeting

The next scheduled meeting date is Monday 30th November 2020 starting at 7.30pm.

# PARISH CHURCH NEWS

*Letter from the Rev Simon White  
Associate Priest, Bures with Assington  
and Little Cornard*

Hello,

November brings with it a short period of remembrance marked by key dates in the calendars of the Christian and wider world.

**1<sup>st</sup>**

The month starts on the 1<sup>st</sup> with All Saints' Day – sometimes known as All Hallows' Day - when we remember significant people who down the ages have inspired others by their faith and service.

**2<sup>nd</sup>**

The death of someone we love always leaves its mark and All Soul's Day on the 2<sup>nd</sup> is a special day for remembering them. In time the wounds heal, but they never entirely disappear and nor should they, for the memory of those we love remains with us always.

**8<sup>th</sup>**

As I write this, we fully intend to have a Remembrance Sunday service in our Church on the 8<sup>th</sup> to remember the contribution of military and civilian service men and women involved in both world wars and later conflicts. You are very welcome to come along to this and any of our other services but please help us with 'Track and Trace' by e-mailing [office@parishchurch.co.uk](mailto:office@parishchurch.co.uk) beforehand if you can, and please bring a mask with you.

**11<sup>th</sup>**

Three days later we remember the end of fighting in the First World War. This will be the 101<sup>st</sup> year Armistice Day has been marked around the United Kingdom with a two Minute Silence at 11am on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month.

**20<sup>th</sup>**

Our church is dedicated to St Edmund, King of the East Angles and we remember his death on the 20<sup>th</sup>. As king, he won the hearts of his subjects by his care of the poor and his steady suppression of wrong-doing. When attacked by the Danes, he refused to give over his kingdom or to renounce his faith in Christ and so was martyred in the year 870.

It is also important this year that we remember all those who have died directly from coronavirus or because of the upheaval the pandemic has caused. We have been confronted by grief and loss on an unprecedented scale with more than 43000 deaths in the UK and more than 1 million people worldwide.

Alongside sadness and memory, these remembrances make space for hope. The light of Easter shines into the dark places of death and illuminate's the memories of those who we no longer see. The undefeated love of Jesus has the last word and gives us strength for the future.

As November and this period of remembrance draws to a close we start looking forward to Christmas with Advent Sunday on the 29<sup>th</sup>. This Christmas the Church will need, in the words of St Paul in Romans 12.15, to '*Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep*'. We will aim to celebrate where we can be together in one place – but also embrace our wider community that wants to join in the celebration but may not be physically able – or emotionally ready – to do so. As we get closer to December we will announce plans ever mindful that they may need to change to keep people safe.

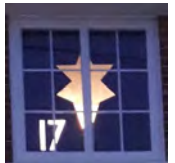

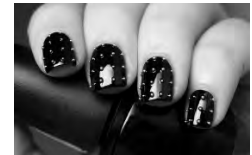

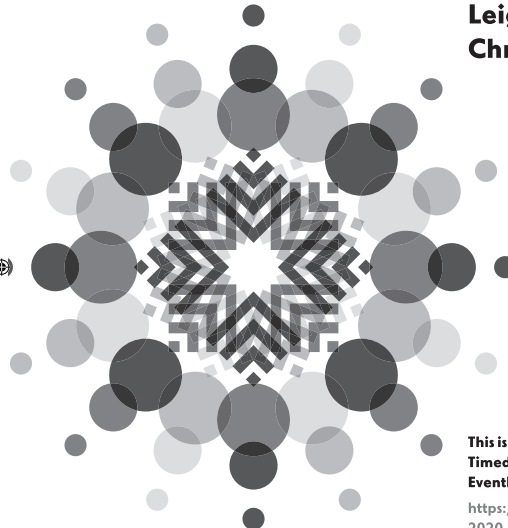
