

an agent on behalf of CH & the figure had taken into account loss of income. Clause 6(a) transfer of title & rights of seller & Clause 4 fence responsibility & maintenance were additional issues raised. The outcome overall was the PC were not prepared to make a commitment to the contract as presented & the matter was to be passed over to the VHMC. The Clerk advised confirmation from the Charity Commission that the existing Playing Field had been officially vested in The Official Custodian was still awaited, the file apparently having been temporarily mislaid.

4. **DONATION** It was decided **not** to make a donation to the Suffolk Association of Youth.

5. **FINANCE** - All councillors were presented with a copy of a Statement of the 1992/93 accounts. The accounts were unanimously approved & signed by the Chairman (pr. MK, scd EN). In the light of earlier discussion on the Village Hall, GD questioned the £220 Planning Fee for the new hall & reminded the PC that this had been authorised with the proviso that same could be reclaimed from the VHMC. The matter was left in abeyance. The Clerk reported **CREDIT** balances of £1181 on BPA account (when confirmation first Precept payment - due end April - should be £2031) and £142 on CURRENT.

Accounts for payment were EE (£88), Audit Commission (£64). In addition Cornhill Insurance Policy was due for renewal on 1st June at a premium of £50 (previously £40) with existing cover for Public Liability, Employers Liability, Money & Fidelity Guarantee. It was agreed to renew on same basis.

Payment of these amounts was authorised. (Pr. GD, EN).

The annual contribution to the Assington Churchyard Maintenance Fund was discussed and it was agreed this would remain at £200 (pr.ST, scd EN).

On the basis of the above payments, the Clerk advised it would be necessary to transfer £350 from BPA to Current.

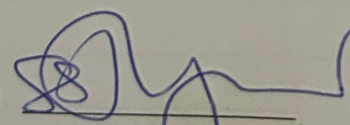
